

## TWENTE POTTERY VILLAGE VISIT (6 HOURS)

Tour Code: TTPOT

### DETAILED ITINERARY

#### DAY 01 : TWANTE SIGHTSEEING (-/-/-)



Our tour guide will pick you up at The Hotel and drive to Pansodan jetty for around 30 min (Pickup time need to be discussed with your guide, subject to your hotel location and public traffic). Take local skiff to cross the Yangon river. (Local skiff operation schedule to be discussed with your guide).

Then biking from Dala to Twante via Twante canal bridge. (Approximately one hour).

Upon arrival in Twante, the road is bumpy and you should be prepared for a 'rustic' but very interesting ride, which provides a glimpse of life on and along the famous Twante Canal, the narrow waterway constructed in 1883 to connect the Yangon and Ayeyarwady Rivers, and still in use today.

In Twante, after a visit to Shwesandaw Pagoda, Nan Taw Gone, visit pottery area where a large part of the population is engaged in pottery production near Twente Canal. Biking through the many workshops and observe this very traditional craft. Return to Yangon from by Biking on Twente-Dala Road to reach Dala and then by taking the local skiff again to Yangon jetty. Then transfer back to your hotel.
